梅志業校長

校不得不轉為線上教學,師生互動受限。再加上我是承接及過渡上一任校長的工作,如何在保持學校傳統的同時創新教學, 讓教育更貼合時代需求,成為一大挑戰。

同學:在如此艱難的環境中,您是如何堅持下來的?

梅校長:我們常說「一步一恩典」,每一步都有不同的恩典,每一步都有神的帶領。就像摩西帶領以色列人過紅海,當杖插在水中時,洪水分開,人得以踏在乾地之中;但是杖未落水,腳未邁入,人就還是害怕的。作為信徒,我們不只要籌算自己的道路,更要相信神、仰賴神的恩典;有了對主的信心和力量,相信神會帶領我們跨過困難,就能在面對挑戰時處之泰然。生活中難免有突如其來的風浪,但作為神的僕人,我們要學會全心全意的倚靠祂。

同學:對於劉永生中學,您最自豪的地方是什麼?

梅校長:最讓我自豪的是我的學生們。我喜歡和年輕人同行, 因為他們充滿熱情和創造力。教育是長遠的事工,我們不僅要 關注學生的現在,更要為他們的未來和永恆生命負責。看到學 生們一路上在各種比賽裡獲得獎項,處事越來越成熟、越來越 聽話受教,讓我覺得很感恩。學校亦有舉辦更多活動,希望學生在"德智體群美靈"六育上均衡發展,而不只是追求學術成績。常聽到坊眾對劉永生中學學生的評價由過去的「死讀書」 到現在的「多活動,多活潑」,這樣的改變亦令我感到欣慰。

同學:在25周年的校慶之際,您有什麼話想對學校的同學和 老師們說的呢?

梅校長:我想今年學校的主題標語能代表我的心底話。今年的主題「承傳永生盼望,標竿直往」是我擬定的。劉永生中學雖然只有25年歷史,但我們仍然堅持將傳承基督教的核心理念——永生與盼望,傳承下去。教育不僅是知識的傳遞,更是生命培育的承傳。我希望我們的學生無論未來走向何方,都能持守真理,活出愛和服務社群的生命。

黃佩雯老師以《人間詞話》的名言概括了悠長的執教心境。

人間詞話中說明人生有三境界,古今之成大事業,大學問者,必經過三種境界:

『昨夜西風凋碧樹。獨上高樓,望盡天 涯路。』此謂第一境界也。

『衣帶漸寬終不悔,為伊消得人憔悴。』此謂第二境界也。

『眾裡尋他千百度,驀然回首,那人卻 在,燈火闌珊處。』此謂第三境界也。

人生第一個境界,往往面對的是艱難的 局勢,但是仍能相信自己,並堅定自己 的信念與方向,因為有立志之心。

人生的第二個境界,是既然已經立志、 下決心,儘管遇到各式各樣的困難,還 是要堅持到底,不怕失敗。

而在人生的第三個境界,經過多年的磨練之後,人生歷練豐富,胸襟豁達,視野開闊,是早年堅持的理想終於實現,總算看到否極泰來,畢生心血所鑄造的

黃佩雯老師認為她現在大抵是處於第二 境,而在生命的滔滔長河之路,時鐘的 分秒慢步之間,她亦希望自身的心境可 以向第三境邁進,以畢生所學教導莘莘 學子,堅持身為老師的責任與自己的理 想。

或許似是而今自忖,生命正行於第二境 的長路上,但願能以憔悴為階,終能抵 達驀然回首的澄明。

在25年教學生涯中,黃佩雯老師最難忘的是在面對班上2位學生因意外離世,在知道消息那刻、不禁在回到學校後擁著同事病哭、潸然淚下。與生命的無常告別,接受突如其來、難以想像的生離死別,成為了教師生涯最沉重的一課。

生命驟然畫下休止符, 距離被明暗無限拉長, 影子陡然間不再晃動,

照片成為永遠的瞬間。

這些碎片終究拼成一句一「存在」本就 是風中的燭火,而人能做的,唯有在風 起時,珍惜風在指間劃過的溫度,或許 當溫度吹進心臟裡,才可不再惋惜失去 人和人的步距,不去怨恨生命的無常。

黃詠恩老師

在不止二十年裡,這所學校不乏黃詠恩老師的身影。她,在校門前看過多少學生、在白板上留下多少數字、在投影上畫過多少圖形,或許以有限的運算後我們仍無從知曉。 時間,在數學裡或許只是一個隻增不減數字,但在她心裡,時間肯定有著不一般的重量。

它的流淌,承載著多少難忘的回憶,比如在25周年感恩崇拜裡,她對獲得20年長期服務獎感到開心,也有不小的觸動。或許時間的流動太過溫柔,以至於她在台上看見那些二十年如一日、一起在學校裡拼搏的戰友和同工,才幡然醒悟:原來在日復一日重複的工作裡,也充滿了來自無窮無盡的往事之中的驚喜與失落,就像0到1裡也充斥著不盡相同、無限的數值。這些數值拼拼湊湊,就像栽種的麥子結出籽粒,終成為了她人生中美麗的數軸。更讓她欣慰的是,看到一代又一代的畢業生生命成長,在不同地方繼續為主發光,心中的喜悅與感動交融,還直言道:「恩典太美麗!」

不過,和她感情最深的,莫過於這所學校吧。「這裡是一片寬廣的稻田。」,而 學生們不就是在這片稻田裡茁壯成長的一株株稻米嗎?在她看來,這裡不單單是 學校,更是神施恩、神看顧、神同在的地方,是她能讚美、服侍神的地方。雖然

學校在四分之 一世紀裡改頭 換面,但她發 現,在時間的 沉澱下,她反 而逐漸看清和 瞭解這所學校 的背後、一直 眷顧的袖: ·「從前風聞有 祢,現在親眼 看見祢。」 從 上一屆畢業的 學生之中方可 看到這點:她 覺得很難忘, 因為他們大多 都樂意打開心 扉 認 識 主 耶 穌, 又願意思



考生命的意義,更積極投入學習,所以在高中的三年裡不斷地經歷很多奇妙的事情,讓他們經歷到神的帶領,對她而言真的很充實和實在。比如,在她最難忘的細胞小組和福音茶座中,他看到老師們的用心準備,更看到同學們在活動中有不同的得益,她真的很感恩。在經歷了時光飛逝,相信她也很感恩有同事的陪伴、感謝學校滋養著學生,滿懷希望和熱誠繼續現身在學校大大小小的角落。

吳寧興老師

吳寧興老師既是本校的老師,亦是本校的校友。他在 大學畢業的一年後便回到母校任教,直至現在已經任 教了六年。

對於吳老師而言,母校是一個有愛的地方,不只是一份工作。在六年的中學生涯中,他感受到這裏老師不

單只是做教導書本上的知識的工作,而是在影響他的 生命。在這裏,他遇到了幾位恩師,他們教會他老師 明白是一份有意義的工作,可以學到如何待人、如何 進入年輕人的生命,並改變他們的生命。在中學的時 候,他已經很想回到母校教導師弟師妹,以薪火相傳 的方式,將自己所學的東西和感受到的愛傳給師弟師 妹,讓他們明白學校不只是教導學生讀書,而是大家 會互相關心。

吳老師認為在讀書期間一段深刻的經歷,是在他中三參與的一次細胞小組。當時他的身體已經很不舒服,本來打算不參與那次的細胞小組,但因朋友都留下來參與,於是他也答應參與。在小組期間,他已感到十分疲累和辛苦。當時,他的班主任發現他的不對勁,便詢問他是否不舒服,亦在細胞小組後為他祈禱。這次經歷令他更加感受到身邊的老師和同學的關懷。

在他剛踏入這所學校時,他認為這裏很陌生,而且老師好像很嚴厲,對學生的品格操守要求很高。後來,他發現老師其實是嚴而有愛,在某些事情上要教導學 生成為好的人。再次回到母校時,他以一個新身份, 以昔日的老師同樣的理念與學生相處。為了培養學生 的品格,即使是處理紀律上的事情,他也會用愛心和 耐性與學生灌通。

在他任教的期間,有一位男學生令他印象深刻。這位學生在學業上比較弱,品行上偶爾也會犯規。在疫情的時候,一次交談中,這位學生與他分享他在昨天一位牧師的講道,亦分享了當中許多信息。他十分驚訝一位在世人中的壞學生竟然會在假日中自己主動上網聽道,並且記住了許多信息。這位學生在中學期間,差點因做出一些不當行為導致無法畢業,但因為他的堅持,該學生最終順利畢業。在這幾年間,他見證了一位不被看好的學生,在幾年成長後,帶著愛順利畢業。

吳老師認為他在中學生涯時是一位內向和不願嘗試新事物的學生。他寄語學生要踏出自己的安舒區,嘗試做多一些不同的事情,即使在當中跌倒,但靠着神可以面對很多困難,神會扶着每一個人面對困難,學到更多。他希望每個人都可以發揮所長,在不同方面發熱發光。

情牽廿五載




